AED - Automated External Defibrillators

Great news, the Valley has two new AEDs (the devices used to restart a person's heart), and they are located at:

County Fayre in the Pohangina Village, on the red door next to the notice board (still to be installed) and Awahou School, on the school driveway under the streetlight. These locations have been chosen for their 24-hour, 7-day-a-week public accessibility, night lighting, and cell phone coverage. These are for everyone's use in an emergency, to help keep Valley residents and visitors alive.

The AEDs are very simple to use. There are instructions on the device, and the 'A' in AED means the device talks you through how to use the device correctly and carry out CPR. If you follow the instructions, you cannot go wrong! Community training in the use of the devices is also being organised – keep an eye out for details.

NZ Police - 105

NZ Police recently launched a new non emergency number, 105. We've done this to make it easier to get hold of us in the event of non-urgent situations or 'Things which have Already Happened', which don't require Police assistance immediately.

You can call us on 105 for all non emergencies, or you can go online at <u>105.police.govt.nz</u> to report things like:

- Lost property
- Theft for a public place or car
- Intentional property damage
- Or to get an update or add info to a previous report

In the event of an emergency, always call 111 - Things that are Happening Now.
