


Kainui Cross Country Event FRIDAY!

DEVELOPMENTALLY & CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE PRACTICE

What are the Report and Photographer roles all about in Wharite during Investigations?

Each day there is one student who is the Reporter and one who is the Photographer. These roles can vary depending on the Learning Intentions and the child completing the task. The teacher decides what the task will be based on the child's learning needs. For example, if a child is the Photographer and is currently learning to recognise numbers to 10 the teacher may decide that he or she takes photos of numbers to 10 around the room. This will then be used later on in the day during the child's maths lesson. For the child who is the Reporter, the teacher may decide that because they are learning to read and write the letter m, they will collect a range of objects which begin with that letter and report back at Reflection Time. This task will also be used during the Reporter's literacy lesson later that day. The theory behind these tasks is that it is 60-80% more likely for children to retain new learning/concepts if it is introduced by themselves or a peer. So they are powerful ways to introduce learning during lessons.
